Regulations Encouraging Graduate Students of the National Taiwan Normal University Graduate Institute of European Cultures and Tourism to Attend Academic Conferences and Publish Papers

Article 1 The Graduate Institute of European Cultures and Tourism (hereafter "this Institute") hereby establishes the Regulations Encouraging Graduate
Students of the National Taiwan Normal University Graduate Institute of European Cultures and Tourism to Attend Academic Conferences and Publish Papers (hereafter "these Regulations") to encourage graduate
students to actively participate in domestic and foreign academic conferences, publish papers, or submit their articles to Europe-themed academic journals.

Article 2 Graduate students of this Institute who meet the following criteria are eligible to apply for the scholarship:

- 1. They are the first authors of the papers.
- 2. This is the first time that their papers/articles have been published, and the co-authors have not applied for grants from other departments using the same papers/articles.

3. The students must list the "National Taiwan Normal University Graduate Institute of European Cultures and Tourism" as the department from which they are publishing their papers/articles.

Article 3 Grant standards

Students can receive a maximum of two grants (listed below) during their

years of study.

- 1. Students who participate in related academic conferences or seminars held in Taiwan and whose submissions have been accepted by the conference organizers and published during the conferences will be awarded a grant of NT\$2,000.
- 2. Students who participate in related academic conferences or seminars held overseas and whose submissions have been accepted by the conference organizers and published during the conferences will be awarded a grant of NT\$5,000.
- 3. Students who submit their articles or monographs to domestic academic journals with a review system that have been accepted for publication will receive a grant of NT<u>\$1,000</u>~8,000 depending on the academic reputation of the journals.
- 4. Students who submit their articles or monographs to foreign academic journals with a review system that have been accepted for publication will be given a grant of NT\$3,000~10,000 depending on the credibility of the journal.
- 5. Students who submit Europe-related articles to domestic or foreign academic journals that have been accepted for publication will be awarded a grant of NT\$1,000.

Applicants need to submit the completed application form, the abstract and full text of their papers (abstracts are not required for non-academic papers), a photocopy of the organizer's invitation letter or the paper acceptance letter, and a photocopy of the conference agenda to this Institute during the semester. The application will be reviewed during the graduate institute affairs meeting, which will then determine whether the application is approved and the grant amount.

Article 5 These Regulations will be implemented once they have been approved by the graduate institute affairs meeting. The same principle applies when amendments are made.
